

Podium Results on World Rally Debut!

Major Motorsport enjoyed major success at the final round of the FIA World Rally Championship; The Wales Rally GB.

Whilst team manager, Simon Mauger, had previously driven in the World Rally Championship for Ford, this was the first time the team would take on the challenge and extra organisation to run a two car team in a World Rally event.

Ben McKay and Jason McKay hired the Major Motorsport R1 Fiesta to tackle the Welsh forests in. The father and son team had not been out rallying in almost a year, since their prize drive from winning the RenaultSport Twingo UK trophy in 2013. Consistency was key to the pairs' success, the crew didn't put a foot wrong throughout the event, the reward for the 22 year old driver being a solid finish in 51st overall and the RC5 class win!!

Gus Greensmith made his World Rally Debut with Carl Williamson co-driving. This was the 17 year olds 3rd event on gravel, and his first event in the new M-Sport built R2 Fiesta, which had been shipped in from Poland just in time for this event. Despite inexperience in the car, a few pacenote errors, and a puncture which cost Gus almost 2 minutes to limp out of the stage, the crew kept the pressure on and by the end of the 3 day event had set several fastest stage times within the class, and finished 42nd overall and 3rd in class RC4!
